
Columbia Heights Jamboree History

The first Columbia Heights celebration was called the "Heights Jubilee"

On Saturday, September 29, 1934, the city prepared to hold the 1st Heights Jubilee Program to celebrate the completion of the pavement and the opening of Central Avenue. The festivities started at 10 am that morning. Governor Floyd B. Olson gave the principal address at 2:30 pm, and the city's businesses were closed to honor the Governor's visit. The Jubilee featured children's programs at the High School athletic field on 41st Avenue. There was a parade featuring school children, the fire department, and

floats that moved down Central Avenue to 37th and returned. There were also races planned for the children which climaxed with a blueberry pie eating contest.

The committee for the Jubilee was composed of Chairman Matt Milner, Chris Anderson, Walter Sochacki, Peter Deanovic, Gust Lindberg, and J.B. McCann. At 2:15 pm, Mayor Ralph Crisp officially opened the celebration when he presented the keys to the city to the public. After the Governor's remarks, the High School Band had a concert. Following the concert, the highway department's Chief Construction Engineer, O.L. Kipp, and Executive James Kelly of the Bureau of Public Roads addressed those present. At 4 pm there was entertainment at the High School field. Being that



this was an election year, all candidates seeking office were permitted to speak. In the evening, US Senator Henrik Shipstead and Congressman Ernest Lundeen addressed the crowd. The day's events culminated with vaudeville show and a street dance. All the businesses decorated their store fronts, helped sponsor concessions, and contributed to the fund to purchase prizes for all the events. Some of the prizes given were for those who had come the farthest distance, oldest couple present, largest family present, and the oldest (in years of residence) Columbia Heights citizen.



And the 2021 Outstanding Citizen Award Winners Are...

Linda Fowler, Adult Category



Volunteerism and community engagement run in the family for Linda Fowler.
Six years after her father, James Fowler, was named Columbia Heights' Humanitarian of the

Year, Linda received the same honor, now known as the Outstanding Citizen Award, in 2021. James isn't alive today to see his daughter earn the same honor as he did, but he didn't miss the chance to tell her how proud of her he was before he passed away last October, Linda said.

Three years ago, Linda began volunteering regularly at SACA Food Shelf alongside her father, a veteran SACA volunteer.

"He influenced me a lot," Linda said. "I enjoyed that time we had there together."

Linda, 62, continues to donate about eight hours a week to SACA, sorting food in the warehouse. It's been a time of high demand.

Linda, a Columbia Heights native who recently retired from Medtronic as a pacemaker analyst and electrical technician, also volunteers her time at First Lutheran Church, gathering supplies for Sunday school teachers, tending to the community garden, and helping out at their farmers market. Last year, to contribute to the pollinator population, she learned how to raise monarch butterflies from eggs, and this summer, she'll be taking a role in the Mayors' Monarch Pledge effort. When she's not volunteering, she makes crafts and donates them. Despite all the ways she's involved in the community, she said she did not expect to win this award. She was nominated by a fellow SACA volunteer and selected by Mayor Amáda Márquez Simula and 2019's Outstanding Citizen Award winner Cathy Miske. She received the news on a voicemail from the City.

"I had to listen to the voicemail three times before I believed it," Linda said. But perhaps her father wouldn't have been so surprised.

Drake Pham, Youth

Drake Pham got involved in community volunteering with the Loaves and Fishes program, working with Columbia Heights Recreation to distribute food to people in need. Later, he joined the Key



Club, a youth volunteer organization, and was president of the local chapter during his junior year at Columbia Heights High School. Now, at 16, Drake has become the City's very first winner of the Outstanding Citizen Award in the youth category designated for youth ages 14-18. Among all the events and programs Drake has helped organize over the years, and all the volunteer opportunities he's taken part in, a highlight has been his work with SACA Food Shelf. Drake partnered with SACA to create volunteer opportunities for Key Club members at the start of the COVID pandemic, and he later worked to rally students to pack groceries for homebound seniors at a time when SACA was short on volunteers due to health concerns.

"Without this effort, the food shelf would have been hard pressed to get food out to so many in need during this pandemic," wrote Drake's nominator. "He not only organized it, he also participated."

Drake, who plans to study sports management after graduation, said he got involved in these programs because he's admired the way people in this community look out for each other and protect one another.

"I wanted to be a part of that," he said.

Pat Sowada Named 2020 Outstanding Citizen

Sowada Received Four Nominations, Won Award Posthumously in 2020

"Pat represented community spirit at its finest," wrote Becky Loader, former library director, in her 2020 Outstanding Citizen nomination form for Patricia Sowada, who was selected for the award with approval from Mayor Donna Schmitt. Pat, who died Oct 2, 2020, at the age of 77, spent decades actively involved in the community. She was appointed to the Columbia Heights Library Board in June of 1989. She was a member at-large from 1989-94, vice chair from 1995-2008, and vice chair again from April 2019 on. She was chair of the board from 2009 to 2019. Pat was also the membership chairperson for the Columbia Heights Sister Cities Committee. Over the years, Pat made a point to attend as many City events as she could. She almost never missed a monthly Coffee With a Cop gathering. She helped out annually at the Library Foundation's Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser. She once worked as a clerk at the City's Top Valu Liquor. Pat crocheted and knitted hats and robes for U of M children's cancer patients. She taught elementary school kids how to knit in after-school



hours. She coordinated the exchange of greeting cards with Highland and Lomianki students for 20 years. She was an active member of Immaculate Conception parish and active with Holy Cross Church in North Prairie as music director and organist. She donated pumpkins every year to the Fire Safety Open House, helped with Heights garden beautification, decorated and rode on the Library's 90th anniversary parade float, and so much more. Pat also earned the Columbia Heights Police Department's annual T. Nightingale Community Service Award for 2020.





2020 Employee of the Year Award Goes to Fire Chief Thompson

In 2020, Fire Chief Charlie Thompson became the 41th employee to be named the City of Columbia Heights Employee of the Year. The year was like no other, but it proved particularly challenging for emergency workers and first-responders. Thompson, in his role as Emergency Manager, assembled the City's COVID-19 Emergency Preparedness Plan to keep the City's employees and residents well informed of the ongoing developments and ever-changing CDC data and recommendations. He and his Public Safety colleagues worked with other City departments to address the local impacts of the unfolding pandemic in a comprehensive and efficient manner while keeping the public educated on proper health and safety protocols. This on top of managing the already demanding day-to-day duties of Fire Chief, a position he filled just months before the pandemic hit.

The coworker who nominated Thompson described him as having incredible foresight. In the early stages of the pandemic, for example, before it was clear how serious things might get, Thompson made sure that Columbia Heights had enough personal protective equipment (PPE) for first-responders and other staff by securing a reserve of PPE gear

that helped get the City through the national PPE shortage. Additionally, after Gov. Tim Walz asked residents to make and donate face

masks to their local fire departments, Thompson helped coordinate a face mask collection effort in April that resulted in 368 mask donations. He then arranged delivery of the masks to local congregate care facilities short on PPE.

But 2020 wasn't all hardship. Thompson also contributed to the City by offering up his very own chili recipe, which helped the Columbia Heights' Team CH-ili win first place at the annual Chili Cook-off fund raiser for the Lee Carlson Center for Mental Health and Well-Being.

2019 Employee of the Year Award Goes to Fire Department Captain

In 2019, Fire Capt. Tony Cuzzupe became the 40th employee to receive the Employee of the Year honor. As a fire captain, Tony is expected to make life-saving decisions at all hours of

the night with little to no sleep over 24-hour shifts. There is no room for error. During his 13 plus years of full-time

experience, he has spent more than 38,000 hours on shift duty, averaging 56 hours a week. Yet, every day, on every call, inspection, or school education event, he rises to the occasion and shows his true heart.

Described by those who nominated him as being one of the most caring and dedicated people they have ever known, as someone who has had myriad chances to make positive impacts in people's lives and who has never passed up the opportunity to do so. For example, while on a rental inspection job, Tony noticed a boy walking a bicycle up the driveway. The boy looked upset. When asked, the boy explained that his day of biking had come to an abrupt end when his bike broke. Tony noticed this boy's distress, took the time to stop and listen to him, and assessed the damage of the bicycle. But he didn't stop there. He promptly grabbed a tool kit from the department's truck and fixed the bike on the spot.

Tony has become a key part of the growth and mentorship of the City's younger firefighters and has demonstrated a true knack for team building. He formed the Columbia Heights Fire Department Honor Guard to help honor the sacrifices made by former firefighters and their families.

Thirty-six years ago, the City Council approved the Employee of the Year Award as a method of rewarding employees seen by their peers and supervisors as deserving of special recognition for their accomplishments and contributions to the City of Columbia Heights. Annually, all Columbia Heights employees have the opportunity to nominate themselves or another employee(s) for the award based on three criteria: Public Relations, Consistency of Performance, and Significant Accomplishments. On rare occasions, more than one employee is selected in a given year. The Employee of the Year nomination review committee is composed of former Employee of the Year recipients who are still employed by the City. We congratulate Chief Thompson and Capt. Cuzzupe for winning this award and for being an asset, not just to the Fire Department, but to the community, to our entire workplace, and our lives.
